## Meet a small charity supporting families

- They collect postcodes from the families accessing the projects they run across south London
- They need to report to their funder and board, showing that they are reaching families most in need of their support
- They want to be able to compare their internal postcode data with other open data sets relating to deprivation as one measure

#### There's a tool for that - Community Lens!

- There is a new funding opportunity to run a family mentoring scheme in Lambeth and Southwark
- The funder is targeting a number of specific wards and so the charity wants to analyse their internal data on this geographical basis

#### There's a tool for that - AutoGeoMapper!

- Does the mapping show they have reach into those areas and have worked with families and other services based there? Can this strengthen their case for a grant?
- What else can mapping their data at ward and borough level show them?
